

District PAC Meeting Minutes for May 9, 2016

2016-2017 Title I – The Title I allocation for 16-17 is \$1,739,887 which is a decrease of \$77,725. Grant guidelines will remain the same for the 16-17 funding year. However, in 2017-2018 ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) will replace the NCLB guidelines.

Community Eligibility Program – The CEP lunch program will continue for 16-17 and all students will receive a free breakfast and lunch.

District Parent Involvement Activities -

- The DPAC parent event will be held on Thursday, September 29th at the high school auditorium at 6:00 PM. The topic will be *“Anyone Can Become Addicted”* and the subject matter will be presented by Fayette County Drug and Alcohol. The presentation will be open to parents of all students, grades K-12. DPAC members will meet at the beginning of the school year to make final plans. Three baskets will be raffled and posters will be prepared to post in each school to announce the workshop.
- End of year PAC meetings are required to be held at all elementary schools. Parents and principals should review the plan along with parent surveys that were collected to make any changes to the plan that they find necessary.
- Title 1 information is to be provided during sessions held at each elementary school during Curriculum Night which is scheduled for Wednesday, September 7th.
- 4Sight tests will continue to be used to track progress goals as required for Title I reporting. This program will be revisited for valid alignment with Common Core Standards. If necessary, a new tool will be researched and implemented in future years.
- Continued Title I expenditures include the district calendar; kindergarten backpacks; DIBELS Next; supplemental ELA and Math resources (Accelerated Reader; Study Island; First in Math); parent budgets for school Title I activities.

Policy and Compact Review – DPAC representatives reviewed and adopted the District Parent Advisory Policy and Title I School Compact with no notable changes.

Questions Addressed – In response to an inquiry, it was noted that Common Core in PA is a law and there are currently no anticipated changes to these standards. Changes would need to be initiated at the state level as a revision of the law.
