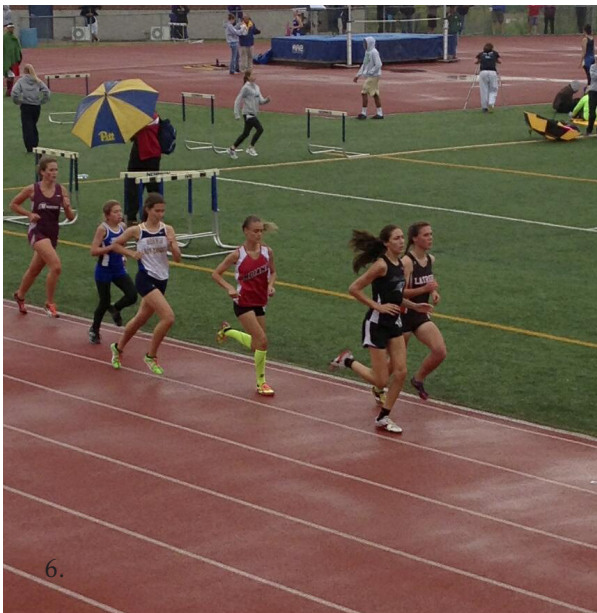

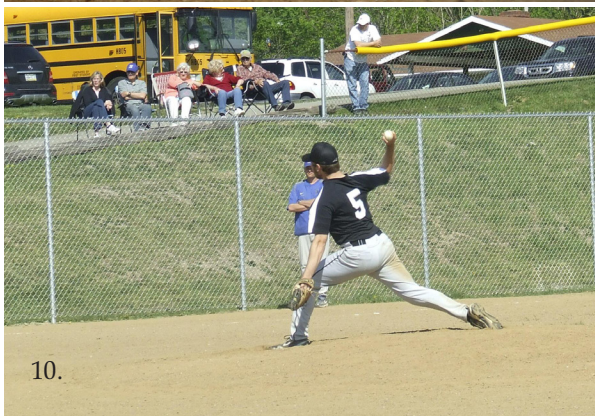

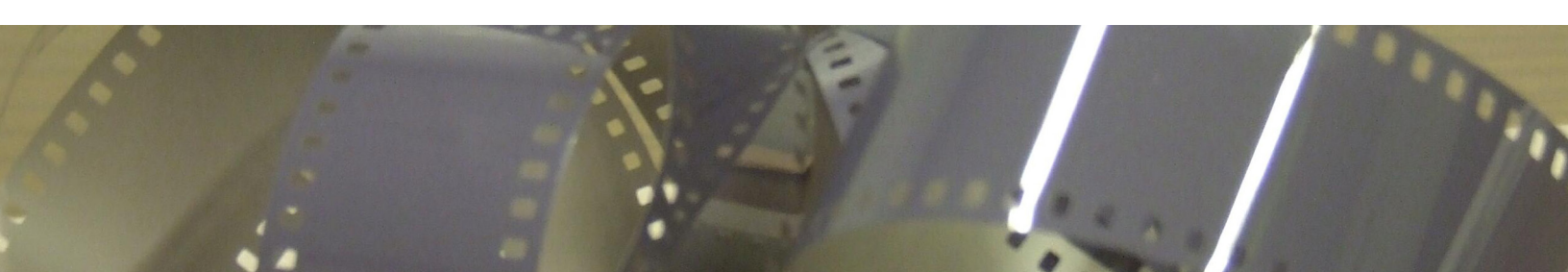

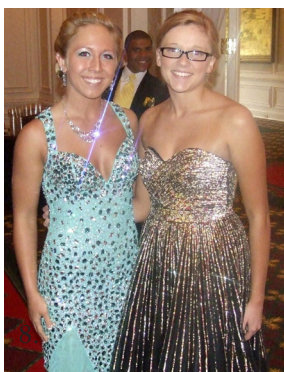

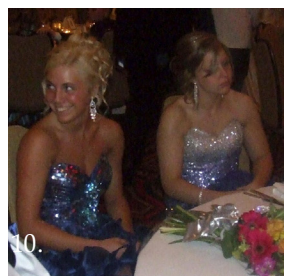

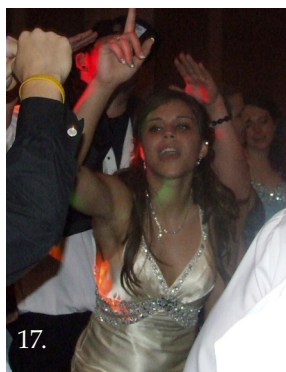

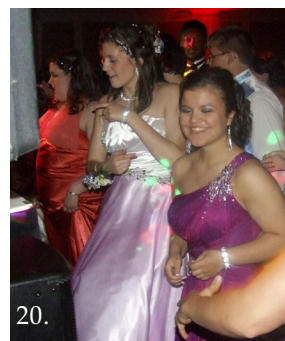

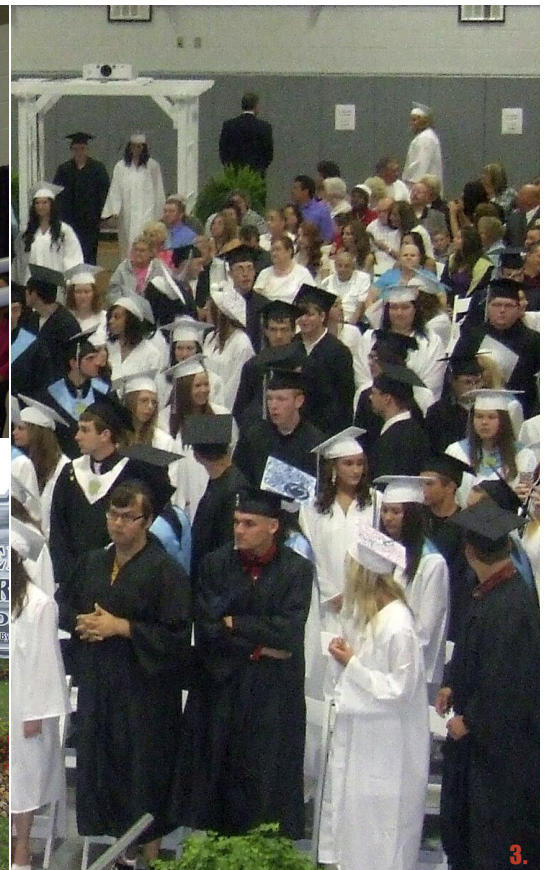
TWILIGHT
